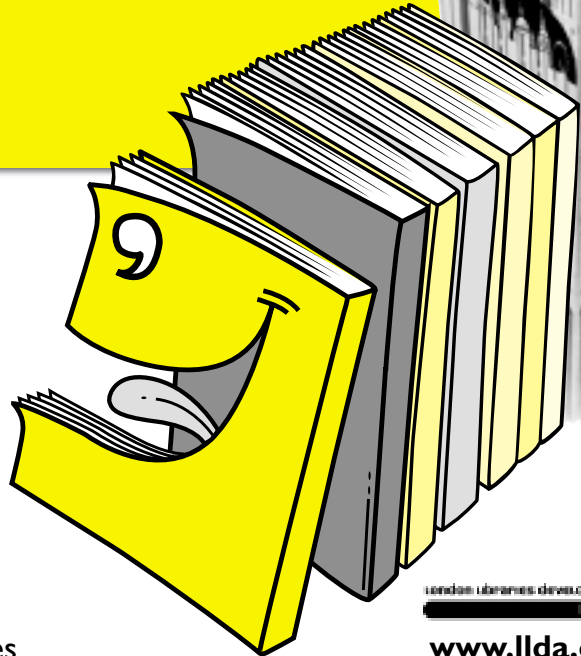

1st prize £250

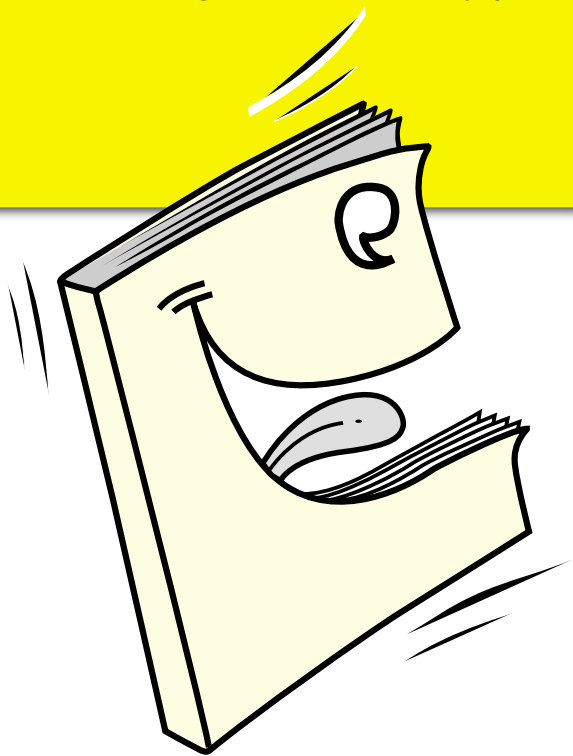
2nd prize £150

- All entries must be in English, the original work of the author and not have been previously broadcast or published.
- By submitting an entry to the competition you agree to have your work performed in the LLDA showcase event at Stratford Circus or to have your work published by the LLDA, acknowledging you as the author.
- Entrants for the under 18 category must be under 18 years old on 6th July 2003 and should give their birth date. Winners of the under 18 category will have to prove their age before receiving acknowledgement of their winning status.
- This competition is not open to direct employees of the London Libraries Development Agency or their immediate families.
- The LLDA reserves the right to change the panel of judges without notice and not to award prizes if, in the opinion of the judges, such action is justified.
- Submission of entry will be deemed to imply unqualified acceptance of the competition's rules and conditions. The judges' decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into.
- Entries submitted cannot be returned
- Only the winners will be contacted personally.
- Prizes will be paid by cheque
- Maximum number of words 1,000. Entries that exceed this limit will be disqualified
- Only one submission per person
- Winners will be notified by 21st July 2003 and the results will be posted on the LLDA website www.llda.org.uk
